- Science Café, Wednesday, December 21 at 7:30 PM. Award winning chemistry profs from the University of Windsor, Drs. Jim Green and Siyaram Pandey will discuss their exciting research that suggests new approaches to cancer treatment. Designed for the general public. Free admission and refreshments.

Science City is usually closed at the beginning of the week, but it will be open on Monday, Dec. 26 through Friday, Dec. 30 from noon to 5 PM, on Saturday Dec. 31 from 10 AM to 5 PM for your family's enjoyment.
